**PRIZE LIST
ANCCE March 2010 Rules**

AWARDS BY SECTION (for sections 1-15)

- 1st (section Champion) - gold medal
- 2nd (section Reserve Champion) - silver medal.
- 3rd place in the section - bronze medal.
- Award for Best Movement within section
- Award for Functionality within participating sections.

At the discretion of the Organizing Committee, ribbons and/or diplomas may accompany the above prizes.

For Sections 1, 2, 3, 4, 5 and 6, Best Movement award shall go to the highest walk/trot score in the section. For Sections 7, 8, 9, 10, 11, 12 and 15, Best Movement award shall go to the highest walk/trot/canter score in the section.

There is an award for functionality for sections 8, 10, and 12. The stallion that obtains the highest score in the functionality test, within the same age group, is the section functionality winner. Tied functionality scores are resolved by awarding 1st place to the horse with the higher conformation score.

SPECIAL AWARDS

The following Special Awards are offered in this ANCCE competition:

1.- BEST BREEDER

All horses entered by breeder, to compete for this award, must be microchipped under the breeder's code and the breeder must be the owner of record.

The breeder must enter at least 6 sections:

A cobra of 3 mares into Section 13
A stallion into Section 8, 10 or 12
A mare into Section 7, 9 or 11 and
Three additional sections

Sections 1, 2, 14 and 15 will not count toward this prize.

The breeder must notify the office in writing of which horses he wants to enter, for this prize. A horse entered to compete for this prize, that fails to show in the Section in which he was entered, will cause the breeder a 2-4 point deduction, depending upon the Section of non-participation. Even if the prize has only one contestant, all requirements must be fulfilled to receive the Best Breeder award.

A chart labeled "Appendix IX", seen in the complete rules at www.ancce.es, is used to determine points earned. To the resulting score, extra points are added:

3 points - Champion Stallion/Mare

2 points - Reserve Stallion/Mare, Champion Colt/Filly, Adult Champion of Movement and Functionality Champion

1 point - Young Champion of Movement, Reserve Champion Colt/Filly and Reserve Champion of Functionality.

After adding these additional points, the resulting sum is divided by the number of entries (cobra counts as one). The breeder with the highest averaged points wins.

In the event of a tie, see full rules at www.ancce.es for description of tie-breaking procedures.

2.- BEST EXHIBITOR

Same rules as for Best Breeder above, except that the contestant for this award need only be the owner of each horse that he exhibits. He may include his own brand in the required group, but must also enter one or more horses of other brands, not microchipped under his own breeder code.

3.- CHAMPION/RESERVE STALLION

The Breed Champion and Reserve Stallion shall be chosen from among those placed 1st and 2nd in Sections 8, 10 and 12, and in the following manner: The 1st Place stallion from each of the indicated Sections shall line up in the center of the arena. The 2nd Place stallion from each of the indicated sections shall remain at one end of the arena. The judge will select the Champion Stallion from one of the three 1st Place Section winners. Then, the stallion that was placed 2nd in the Section from which the Champion came shall be brought to the center of the arena to join the two remaining 1st Place Section winners, and the Reserve shall be chosen from those three stallions.

4.- CHAMPION/ RESERVE MARE

The Mare Breed Champion and Reserve shall be chosen from among those placed 1st and 2nd in Sections 7, 9 and 11 using the same procedures established for the Champion Stallion.

5. CHAMPION/RESERVE COLT

This Award has been established for horses in Sections 4 and 6, to determine the Champion and Reserve Colt. The procedure for this award shall be identical to the one used for the Champion Stallion above.

6.- CHAMPION/RESERVE FILLY

This Award has been established for the horses in Sections 3 and 5, from which shall be determined the Champion and Reserve Filly. The procedure for this award shall be identical to the one used for the Champion Stallion above.

7.- CHAMPION/ RESERVE OF FUNCTIONALITY

The Award for the Champion of Functionality shall automatically be awarded to the Stallion (sections 8, 10 & 12) that achieves the highest score. The Reserve shall be the horse that obtains the second best score. In the event of a tie, this shall be awarded to the horse that has obtained the highest morphology score. Should the tie continue, the winner shall be the horse with the best score for in-hand movements.

8.- YOUNG CHAMPION OF MOVEMENTS

Those horses from Sections 3, 4, 5 and 6, (fillies and colts 2 & 3 years old) winning Best Movements in their Section, will compete for this award. The horses must show walk and trot twice in this championship class.

9. - ADULT CHAMPION OF MOVEMENTS

Those horses in Sections 7, 8, 9, 10, 11 and 12 (mares and stallions four years and older) winning Best Movements in their Section, will compete for this award. Movements are to be shown twice for the judge.

All horses qualified by Section results to compete for these special prizes are required to compete. Any horse failing to appear, regardless of cause, shall be disqualified, and will be subject to other penalties prescribed by the ANCCE rules. If in the case of prizes numbered above as **3, 4, 5, and 6**, a first place winner of a participating section fails to appear for the special prize, it will be replaced by the second place winner of that section, to be compared against the other first place winners. Such substitution only applies to first place within these prizes.
